Confidentiality and Disagreements:

- Maintain the confidentiality of matters discussed within CAAS.
- Understand that CAAS is not responsible for disagreements in private conversations or group settings (e.g., WhatsApp) among members.

Diversity and Celebration:

- Respect and celebrate people's diversity.
- Honour individuals for who they are.

Challenge Prejudice and Discrimination:

- Actively challenge prejudice, stereotypes, and discrimination.
- Stand against all forms of bullying.
- Treat staff, fellow members, and external visitors with respect.

Name and Pronouns:

- Use the name and gender pronouns chosen by each individual.

Alcohol and Drug-Free Space:

- Help maintain a space free from alcohol and drugs.

Effective Communication:

- Communicate clearly, avoiding language that may offend others.
- Seek clarification when needed.

Personal Responsibility:

- Take responsibility for your actions and learning.

Respect Boundaries:

- Respect other people's beliefs, boundaries, and property.
- Challenge statements, not the person making them.

Listening and Safety:

- Listen when others speak.
- Be aware that CAAS staff are available to discuss any issues you may have.
- Prioritise your safety and the safety of others; report health and safety concerns to a CAAS staff member.
